Narrative

On August 23, 2019, responding officers received a call about multiple dogs attacking a 19 year old girl. Upon arrival Officer Parrott and myself spoke to the complainant, Jordan Chapman who witnessed the dogs mauling the victim, who was identified as Adrianna O'shea. Ms. Chapman advised that Adrianna was coming over to pick up her purse at Ms. Chapman's house because she had forgotten it there the night before. Ms. Chapman advised she heard screaming and ran to the door and she saw 4-5 dogs attacking Adrianna. She advised the dogs were dragging her and tossing her in the air. Officer C. Coleman and Officer B. Headrick were the first responding officers on scene. They advised upon arrival Adrianna had jumped a small fence to try to get away from the dogs. Officer Coleman advised he had to shoot one of the dogs because it was charging them and trying to attack them as well. Officers advised Ms. Adrianna has multiple bite wounds to both her arms and all over her body. They advised her left arm was badly bitten and she had lost a lot of blood. Officer Parrott and myself briefly saw the victim when they were bringing her to the ambulance. The victim was naked because the dogs tore her clothes off during the attack. She was covered in blood and debris and non-responsive. She was taken to UT Medical Center.

The owner Rodnee Herald arrived and she was advised that her dogs had attacked a girl pretty badly. She advised the dogs are contained in her yard by an invisible fence that is above ground and she showed us the wire. Mrs. Herald also advised to Law Enforcement that "the dogs were doing their jobs." She advised the dogs are family owned by her, her son Franklin and her son Bosco, a black and tan, male Rottweiler/lab type dog named Duke (who was the dog that was

was hostile and proclaimed "We killed his dog!" It was at that time he claimed ownership of the deceased dog. This dog was a (per the Rodnee and Franklin's identification, a lab/mastiff mix) very large short haired black altered male. Shortly after a white van arrived. The landlord Rodnee Herald arrived. She stated the dogs are family dogs, the family being: herself, her husband (Franklin Delanore Herald, II) and her son (Franklin Delanore Herald, III). She asked where Franklin was, claiming "Franklin trained one of the dogs to attack when guns are pointed at the dog." She pointed out the dog shot by officers was not the dog that was trained to react that way, claiming it was the other black dog. While loading the dogs on the vehicle she stated the dogs were just "Doing their job." Ms Herald loaded 3 dogs on Officer Thatcher's vehicle to be transported to Young-Williams Animal Center. Officer Hinkley and Officer Baker loaded the deceased dog (a black altered male, lab/mastiff mix breed) and the 4 month old brindled unaltered female pitt bull on my vehicle to be transported to Young-Williams Animal Center.

Upon my arrival to Young-Williams Animal Center Shelter staff member Jersey retrieved a cart and a bag. Officer Thatcher assisted her in removing the deceased dog from my vehicle to place the dog in the freezer to hold for evidence. I then pulled in the intake bay of Young-Williams Animal Center, closed the garage bay and removed the 4 month old female dog and placed it in the Dangerous Dog Holding kennel designated by intake staff, her intake form was noted by myself Potentially Dangerous Dog.
